OVERVIEW

By federal statute (Community Service Block Grant Act) the Delmarva Community Services, Inc. (DCS) Community Action Division is required to complete an inclusive community needs assessment every three years to support development of a robust and active strategic plan. The CSBG Organizational Standards guide this research and planning work, as well as all other aspects of Community Action Program (CAP) administration. The Organizational Standards were designed to ensure that local CAPs have the capacity to provide high-quality services to low-income families and communities. The CSBG Organizational Standards relevant to this work were cited in the Delmarva Community Services, Inc. Community Action Program requested scope of services and are presented in the table below. They fall within the following categories:

- Category 1: Consumer Input and Involvement, which asserts the value of elevating the voice of people with lived experience.
- ➤ Category 2: Community Engagement, which cites the importance of cross-sector, cross-agency partnerships and transparent communication with the community.
- Category 3: Community Assessment, which outlines the need for regular, inclusive assessment of community needs and resources.
- > Category 4: Organizational Leadership, which delineates the role of a well-functioning board and key administrative functions.
- > Category 6: Strategic Planning, which guides CAP strategic planning.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this assessment is to develop a deeper understanding of our customers' needs and goals for self-sufficiency, economic security and strengthening civic and community engagement. While DCS service delivery area encompasses Dorchester, Talbot, Caroline and Kent Counties in Maryland and Sussex County in Delaware, for the purposes of this assessment, we surveyed and collected data and input from residents of Dorchester County only as DCS serves as the designated Community Action Agency for this County.













Education

Attainment - Overview

Educational Attainment shows the distribution of the highest level of education achieved in the report area, and helps schools and businesses to understand the needs of adults, whether it be workforce training or the ability to develop science, technology, engineering, and mathematics opportunities. Educational attainment is calculated for persons over 25 years old, and is an estimated average for the period from 2017 to 2021.



Housing Quality - Substandard Housing

This indicator reports the number and percentage of owner- and renter-occupied housing units having at least one of the following conditions: 1) lacking complete plumbing facilities, 2) lacking complete kitchen facilities, 3) with 1 or more occupants per room, 4) selected monthly owner costs as a percentage of household income greater than 30%, and 5) gross rent as a percentage of household income greater than 30%. Selected conditions provide information in assessing the quality of the housing inventory and its occupants. This data is used to easily identify homes where the quality of living and housing can be considered substandard. Of the 13,123 total occupied housing units in the report area, 4,176 or 31.82% have one or more substandard conditions.



Evictions



Homeless Children & Youth


This indicator reports the number of homeless children and youth enrolled in the public school system during the school year 2019-2020. According to the data source definitions, homelessness is defined as lacking a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence. Those who are homeless may be sharing the housing of other persons, living in motels, hotels, or camping grounds, in emergency transitional shelters, or may be unsheltered. Data are aggregated to the report-area level based on school-district summaries where three or more homeless children are counted.

In the report area, of all the 4,710 students enrolled in reported districts during the school year 2019-2020, there were 60 or 1.30% homeless students,

which is lower than the statewide rate of 1.74%.



ALICE IN DORCHESTER COUNTY

ALICE is an acronym **for Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed** — households that earn more than the Federal Poverty Level, but less than the basic cost of living for the county. While conditions have improved for some households, many continue to struggle, especially as wages fail to keep pace with the rising cost of household essentials (housing, child care, food, transportation, health care, and a basic smartphone plan). Households below the ALICE Threshold — ALICE households plus those in poverty — can't afford the essentials.

Financial Hardship Has Changed Over Time in Dorchester County

As circumstances change, households may find themselves below or above the ALICE Threshold at different times. While the COVID-19 pandemic brought employment shifts, health struggles, and school/business closures in 2021, it also spurred unprecedented public assistance through pandemic relief measures. In 2019, 829,475 households in Maryland were below the ALICE Threshold; by 2021 that number had changed to 899,798.

The Cost of Basics Outpaces Wages

The Household Survival Budget reflects the minimum cost to live and work in the modern economy and includes housing, child care, food, transportation, health care, a smartphone plan, and taxes. It does not include savings for emergencies or future goals like college or retirement. In 2021, household costs in every county in Maryland were well above the Federal Poverty Level of \$12,880 for a single adult and \$26.500 for a family of four.

ASSESSSMENT RESULTS

QUALITATAIVE NARRATIVE OF PRIORITIES AND KEY FINDINGS

The 2022 Community Needs Assessment aims to discover the most pressing challenges residents of Dorchester County face, the needs of the community, and the causes and conditions of poverty in the service area, so that Delmarva Community Services, Inc. (DCS) can be better prepared to address the issues.

COMMUNITY NEEDS ASSESSMENT PROCESS:

Phase 1-(August 1-August 31, 2022) - More than 250 surveys were either mailed or handed out to Dorchester County residents visiting the center during the specified period. Individuals were encouraged to complete the needs assessment survey in an effort to assist us in identifying the greatest needs facing themselves and their family.


Phase 2 - (August 8 - September 9, 2022) Community Partners and Stakeholders are asked to complete surveys using survey monkey online tool to help us identify commonality in areas of need for the populations we mutually serve, to identify unmet needs and to identify services being duplicated or replicated within the service area.

The Board of Directors were mailed a survey to complete offering suggestions for areas of concern as they see it and from the perspective of consumers who may-live in their community/jurisdictions.

Continuous Evaluation/Assessment - Quarterly meetings are held with DCS program coordinators to identify the needs and concerns of the community. Discussions are held with community partners on a regular basis to determine the general needs of the community.

The following is a breakdown of the survey respondents:

OTHER CONCERNS/RECOMMENDATIONS:

Many families continue to struggle following the pandemic crisis. How can the community provide long-lasting support beyond CARES funding that is ending?

Continue to build on the solid relationships already formed with partners in the community with honest, open dialog about ways to develop affordable housing in Dorchester County

There's a generation of children who have fallen behind during the pandemic that will likely need additional resources in the coming years to help them regain ground and meet their developmental milestones. DCS can assist in identifying families who are struggling and connect them with the Board of Education for supportive services.



PLAN OF ACTION

Delmarva Community Services, Inc. (DCS) will use the data gathered to set priorities for the annual CSBG plan over the next 3 years. Additionally, we recognize responses to the survey were lackluster and attribute part of that to the pandemic crisis. We will continue to provide surveys to gauge the satisfaction/dissatisfaction of our consumers and will seek the input and advice of our community partners and stakeholders, as well as continued input from the Board of Directors.

Data will also be shared with the 2GEN guiding coalition to determine ways in which we can address the common concerns and priorities of DCS and other guiding coalition member agencies. Additionally, this data will be used as the agency continues to develop effective strategies that align with the CSBG Organizational Standards

This data will also be used as the agency completes their five-year Strategic plan update in 2023-2024. During this process, consumers, community partners and stakeholders, Board of Directors, management and direct care support personnel and staff of the agency will come together and assess the direction of the agency as well as the priorities of the community at large and how DCS can play an integral role in empowering the families we serve.

This assessment is hereby presented to the Board of Directors at the June 28, 2023 meeting for review, additional input, and approval. Upon approval, the report will be made available on the DCS website and hard copies will be available in the consumer lobby area for review.
